***RORC Support for Resident Scholarship (Research and other Scholarly Activities)**

As a new addition to the Summit, we are excited to host an afternoon breakout session, specifically designed for residents, faculty and residency program leaders to discuss and plan a scholarly project. The session will with an interactive design session to explore the potential for scholarly activity and innovation around the Reach Out and Read intervention. Residents will have time during the session to plan and prepare a proposal. The session will conclude with a presentation of proposals and a panel of reviewers will select a winning proposal that Reach Out and Read Carolinas will fund, up to \$2,500.00.

We invite all 1st and 2nd year residents who can carry out the project during the course of the academic year: July 2019 – July 2020.
